

Grand Junction, Colo., September 27, 1910.

Regular Meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Minutes The minutes of the regular meeting of September 20 were read and approved.

Approved The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution.

Resolution Whereas, It has been shown to the satisfaction of the City Commissioners that it is practically impossible without serious detriment to the Grand Valley National Bank building, corner Fifth and Main streets, to comply with the requirements of the city ordinance in regard to plumbing in the matter of basin wastes and vents accordingly; therefore, be it

Resolved, That a special permit

be, and hereby is, granted to use 2-inch waste pipes from said basins, instead of 3-inch pipes, as required by ordinance, in the said Grand Valley National Bank building.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The following resolution was introduced and read to the Council:

Resolution

Whereas, The City of Grand Junction has owned and the people thereof have for many years continuously used a crossing over the tracks and right-of-way of the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, said crossing being a continuation of Lawrence avenue in Crawford's subdivision of said city produced in a northerly direction until it meets Colorado avenue of said city, and

Whereas, The Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Company, have recently obstructed said crossing by piling coal and leaving cars thereon, so that it is impossible for the public to use the said crossing; therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Mayor be, and he is, hereby instructed to serve a written notice on the said railroad company, demanding that all obstructions to the use of said crossing be removed within ten days or that suit will be begun against the said Railroad Company to clear the said crossing for traffic.
