A Proposed Ordinance Read An ordinance providing for the Erection of Signs and the Maintenance of the same in a Safe Condition and Providing Penalties for a Violation of the Provisions of the Ordinance, was introduced by Commissioner Vorbeck and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

An Agreement by and between the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Company and the City of Grand Junction, granting to the City of Grand Junction the right to lay and maintain lines of ^{cast-}iron pipe for conducting water across the lands and under the tracks of the railroad company at the places mentioned in said agreement upon terms and conditions therein mentioned, was presented and read to the Council.
