

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 9, 1910.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction, convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 4 o'clock p.m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Roll Call  
Minutes Approved

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 1<sup>st</sup> and November 4<sup>th</sup> were read and approved.

Lawrence & Crossing presented Mr. George Bullock, representing citizens and residents of Crawfords addition, appeared before the Council and spoke in reference to the matter of the obstruction of the railway crossing at Lawrence and Colorado avenues, and presented a complaint, prepared by himself, against the railroad company.

Report of Mayor

Mayor Todd reported that, in accordance with resolution adopted by the Council at its regular meeting held September 27<sup>th</sup>, written notice had been served upon the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, demanding the removal of all obstructions from the public crossing over and across the tracks from Lawrence avenue to Colorado avenue in this city, and that, with the exception of the removal of the pile of coal, no attention had been paid by the railroad company to said notice; and recommended that suit be commenced against Railroad Company.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the report of the Mayor be accepted, and that suit be accepted and commenced against the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, looking to the assertion and maintenance of the public rights, in and about and to said crossing at Lawrence avenue, as a public thoroughfare.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Commissioner of Highways be authorized to purchase 6825 lbs of oats at \$1.70 per cwt., and to pay balance on horse, amounting to \$140.00.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The Clerk stated that the National Surety Company had requested the release of the bond of F. C. Manear, as employment agent, and that the said Manear had failed to procure a license for employment agency, not having paid the necessary fee therefor.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the bond of F. C. Manear be released and returned to the National Surety Company, and that the order of the Council to issue license to the said F. C. Manear be rescinded.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and

seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the City's attorneys, be authorized to consult with Mr. H. N. Haynes, of Greeley, Colorado, and ascertain what his fee would be to render an opinion in the pending Kannah Creek water condemnation suit, and that they be instructed to communicate with Mr. Haynes over the long distance telephone.

*Motion carried*

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the Council adjourned to meet at the office of Logan & Miller, at 8 o'clock p.m.

paid Mr. Haynes for his services be \$250<sup>00</sup>  
and expenses.
