Whereas, a number of bills against the city, incurred in the Hannah Creek water condemnation suit now pending in the District Court, have been duly allowed and ordered paid by the Council and warrants ordered drawn on the Water Fund in payment of same, and

Whereas, the payment of said bills will deplete the appropriation for the Water fund, therefore be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that there be and hereby is transferred from the General Fund to the Water Fund the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000.⁰⁰) Dollars.

Resolution Whereas, The former City Council, which retired from office November 8, 1909, allowed a number of bills to be drawn on the General Fund (which then was depleted) when a new appropriation be made, and

Whereas, H. F. Vorbeck, city clerk under the former Council, turned over to the present City Clerk all said bills and vouchers allowed by the former Council, to be paid when there be available funds, and

Whereas, warrants were issued in payment of said bills by the present City Council and dated January 29, 1910, and

Whereas, said bills and vouchers were not entered upon the minutes of the former City Council; therefore be it
