Regular Meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4.01 clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Vedder, acting Mayor, in the chair.

Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmburg. Absent: Mayor Todd.

Minutes Approved Acting City Attorney Tupper was present. The minutes of the regular meeting of November 29th and adjourned session of December 2d were read and approved.

Communication A communication from J. F. Halderman and L. L. Morrison, attorneys for J. L. Marner, in reference to claim of the said Marner against the city for an <sup>alleged</sup> injury suffered by him, was read to the Council.

Referred to Mayor and City Attorney On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the communication was referred to the Mayor and City Attorney.

bids that may be submitted.
