Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order for the city a Standard motor-propelled combination Hose Wagon and Chemical Engine, and that the Mayor and Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to enter into a contract with the Seagrave Company, for the delivery of same, for Four Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$4,200) less \$150<sup>00</sup>, allowed for freight, according to specifications in contract.
