The proposal and contract from the Seagrave Company of Columbus, Ohio, for furnishing the City with a Standard Motor-Propelled Combination Hose Wagon and Chemical Engine, was presented to the Council.

Purchase of a Standard Motor-Propelled Combination Hose Wagon and Chemical Engine Authorized. Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to order for the City a Standard motor-propelled combination Hose Wagon and Chemical Engine, and that the Mayor and Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to enter into a contract with the Seagrave Company, for the delivery of same, for Four Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$4,200) less \$150⁰⁰, allowed for freight, according to specifications in contract.
