

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 20, 1910.

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Minutes The minutes of the regular meeting of December 13th were read and approved.

Communication ordered filed. A communication from Governor Shafroth in reference to the annual meeting of the Colorado State Association for the Prevention and Control of Tuberculosis, was read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the communication was ordered placed on file.

Claim disallowed. The acting City Attorney and the Mayor, to whom had been referred the claim of Mrs. Minnie Chelf for \$200⁰⁰, reported no liability for the city and recommended that the claim be disallowed.

Whereas, In the preparation of testimony for the pending Kannah Creek water condemnation suit, it has been found necessary to employ special engineers and others to make surveys of Kannah Creek ranches and prepare data, etc.; and

Whereas, the present balance of the regular and special appropriations for the maintenance of the Department of Water and Sewers is not sufficient to meet the expenses incurred

for the preparation of said testimony; therefore be it

Resolved, By the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that there be and hereby is transferred from the General Fund to the Water Fund the sum of One Thousand (\$1,000⁰⁰) Dollars.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

Resolution Adopted. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

Whereas, It has been the custom for many years past to pay city officers and employes their December salaries before Christmas, therefore be it

Resolved, By the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the Mayor and City Clerk be and hereby are authorized and instructed to issue the usual warrants in payment of the December salaries of all regular salaried officers and employes of the City on or before December 24, 1910.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
