

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 30, 1910.

**Special Meeting** A special session of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, called by the Commissioner of Public Affairs, convened at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

**Roll call** Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

The following resolution, introduced by Commissioner Vorbeck, was read by the clerk:

#### Resolution

**Resolution.** Whereas, During the month of July, 1910, a meter was placed on the plank of the Grand Junction Electric Light Co. which showed a reading of the consumption of water amounting to \$291.40, and

Whereas, Said meter was subsequently taken out and another meter installed, and

Whereas, This second meter was in during September, October and November, for which period the average reading showed water used amounting to \$323.25 for the three months, or an average of \$107.75 per month, and

Whereas, It is the opinion of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers that the registering of the meter that was in the month of July was erroneous; be it, therefore,

Resolved, That the reading of the new meter be, and the same is hereby considered to be the approximate average amount of water used during the month of July, and that said average of \$107.75 be the amount chargeable for said month of July, and that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to accept said amount for the water rent for said month of July, 1910.

**Motion** Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of

Resolution roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Adopted Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scoville,  
yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea,  
the Mayor declared the motion carried  
and the resolution adopted.

Adjourned On motion of Commissioner Holmberg,  
seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the  
Council adjourned.
