Application was made by the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company to construct a track across Seventh street.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company be granted the right to construct a railroad track across Seventh street, on the east side of said street, about 108 feet north of and parallel with the north line of Third avenue, in Milldale subdivision of the City of Grand Junction, subject to the terms and provisions of Section 127 of the Charter.
