Schwenker for the collection and disposal of garbage and the cleaning of grease traps be accepted, and that the City Attorney be instructed to draw up a contract with Mr. Schwenker for the performance of the work for nine months from February 15, 1911, for \$425⁰⁰ per month.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution

Whereas, on the 15th day of October, A.D. 1908, Joe W. Rozelle made an agreement with the City Council of the City of Grand Junction to revise and compile the ordinances of the said city, agreeing to do the work in proper manner and to have said work of revision ready for the printer by February 1, 1909, and to receive the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars in cash, when the work was done, and in addition to said sum a safe belonging to the city; which said agreement was duly accepted and recorded on the minutes of the Council, and

Whereas, the City Council of said city delivered to said Joe W. Rozelle a safe belonging to the City, and on the 16th day of April, A.D. 1909, paid to the said Joe W. Rozelle the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars as balance of compensation for the work of revising the ordinances of said city; and

Whereas, the said Joe W. Rozelle has not to this day completed said work of

revising the ordinances of said city according to the agreement made with the City Council of said city; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the said work should have been completed long ago; and be it further

Resolved, that the City Clerk be, and hereby is, instructed to notify the said Joe W. Rozelle that unless the said work is completed as called for by the contract and turned over to the City Council within thirty days, suit will be begun to recover the money and safe heretofore given the said Joe W. Rozelle by the City of Grand Junction.
