

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 31, 1911.

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call. Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Minutes approved. The minutes of the regular meeting of January 24th were read and approved.

Quarterly Report of Com. Fin & Supplies accepted. The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies having been examined and found correct by the auditor, the report was, on motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Quarterly Report of Judge of the Municipal Court accepted. The quarterly report of the Judge of the Municipal Court having been examined and found correct by the Auditor, the report was, on motion of Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Quarterly Report of the Com. of Highways accepted. The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways having been examined and approved by the auditor, the report was, on motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that in the contract to be made with A. C. Schwenker for the collection of garbage and cleaning of grease traps the amount of the bond required be placed at Two Thousand (\$2,000⁰⁰) Dollars.

Carried The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried. On the petition of S. O. Burkett and others

asking that an arc light be placed at Thirteenth street and Rood avenue, Mayor Todd, to whom the same had been referred, reported favorably and recommended that the light be placed at said point.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg that the report be accepted and that an arc light be ordered placed at the intersection of Thirteenth street and Rood avenue.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

A communication from C. P. McGary in reference to rates for horseshoeing was read; also a communication in reference to the convention of plumbers and sanitary engineers to be held in Milwaukee.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the communications were ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that Joe W. Rozelle, in the work of revising the City Ordinances, be allowed to use the scrap book of printed ordinances at his office and have access to the original book of City Ordinances in the City Hall only, and that he be given desk room in the City Hall for the performance of the work at any time during office hours. The motion carried.
