

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 14, 1911.

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m. in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

Minutes approved Acting City Attorney Tupper was present. The minutes of the regular meeting of February 7<sup>th</sup> were read and approved. The application of J. M. Cameron for a permit to erect an electric sign at 411 Main street was read.

Mr. Cameron's application for permit to erect electric sign Mayor Todd and Commissioner Kolmburg having recommended that the petition be granted, it was moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that a permit be granted J. M. Cameron to erect an illuminated sign at 411 Main street to conform with the provisions of the city ordinance. The motion carried.

Report of City Weigher accepted The report of the City Weigher for the month of January having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the report was, on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Paul E. Cabaret & Co., quoting prices on light standards for the Ensign fountain, was read.

Commissioners Vorbeck and Vedder Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, that the matter of interviewing the Grand Junction Electric Gas & Mfg. Co., in reference to a standard and light for the Ensign fountain, be referred to a special committee to be appointed by the Mayor.

The motion carried, and the Mayor appointed Commissioners Vorbeck and Vedder to act as said committee.
