A proposed ordinance, entitled, "An Ordinance to Provide for Establishing and Maintaining Permanent Registration Lists of all Qualified Electors in Election Precincts within the City of Grand Junction, for use in Municipal Elections; To Provide for Punishing All Violations Thereof, and Appointment of Judges for Special Elections where no candidates are to be Voted on," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.
