

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 1st, 1911.

Adjourned Session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call Upon call of roll the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following bills, having been audited and approved by heads of departments were read:

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

Bills Allowed All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution.

Whereas, under the terms and provisions of Chapter 123, 1908 Revised Statutes, of the State of Colorado, property within towns and cities of Colorado is taxed for the purpose of maintaining county roads outside of the limits of the incorporated towns and cities, none of which road tax is expended within the limits of such incorporated towns and cities; and

Whereas, the said laws authorize the County Commissioners of each county to refund such part of such tax so collected

to the towns and cities within which it is collected as in their discretion is proper; and

Whereas, the commissioners of many counties of Colorado and particularly of Mesa County refuse to so refund any of such tax to the towns and cities within which the same is collected; and

Whereas, a bill has lately been introduced in the Senate of the State of Colorado by Sen. Geo. Stephan and known as Senate Bill No. 334 which bill provides that it shall be obligatory upon the county commissioners of each county to refund at least one-half of the county tax collected for roads and bridges within the limits of the towns and cities, to such towns and cities to be used therein for road purposes;

Therefore, be it Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that it heartily approves of said proposed law and urges the passage of the same, and

Be it Further Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be sent to Representative A. C. Newton and to Senator George Stephan, and to the City Councils of the towns and cities of Colorado, requesting their co-operation in securing the passage of said bill.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
