Whereas, under the terms and provisions of Chapter 123, 1908 Revised Statutes, of the State of Colorado, property within towns and cities of Colorado is taxed for the purpose of maintaining country roads ontside of the limits of the incorporated towns and cities, none of which road tax is expended within the limits of such incorporated towns and cities; and Whereas, the said laws outhorize the refund such part of such tax so collected

to the town and cities within which it is collected as in their discretion is proper; Whereas, the commissioners of many counties of Colorado and particularly of Mesa County refuse to so refund any of such tax to the towns and cities within which the same is collected; and Whereas, a bill has lately been introduced in the Senate of the State of Colorado by Sen. Sw. Stephan and Known as Senate Bill No. 334 which bill provides that it shall be obligatory upon the county commissioners of lack county to refund at least one half of the county tax collected for roads and bridges within the limits of the towns and cities, to such towns and cities to be used therein for road purposes; Therefore, be it Resolved, by the City Council of the leity of Grand Junction that it heartily approves of said proposed law and urges the passage of the same, Be it Further Resolved, that a copy of this resolution be sent to Representative A. C. Newton and to Senator George Stephan, and to the City Councils of the towns and cities of Colorado, requesting their co-operation in securing the passage of said bill. Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Veddu that the resolution as read be passed and adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as adopted follows: Toda, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Dovill yea; Holmburg, yea. all the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted. The bids of Edward Johnson, H. a. Polker and Harris & Welch for con. structing sidewalk on three sides of

400 Maple Park and for Coping in Park Bids for were read. Lidewall Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck Construction seconded by Commissioner Vedder Maple that the bids be held over until next Park Friday, in order to permit Edward Johnson and Harris & Welch to make an offer for the old sidewalk. The motion carried unanimously. On motion of Commissioner Vorbede, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, adjourn the Council adjourned to Friday, March 3d, at 4 o clock p, m.
