Adjourned  
session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in adjourned session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

The bonds of Edward Johnson, Henry Polker, and Harris & Welch, applicants for license to do cement sidewalk construction, which had been referred to the city clerk, were reported to have been corrected so as to run until the end of the fiscal year.

Moved by Commissioner Scovill and

seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the bonds of Edward Johnson, Henry Polka, and Harris & Welch be accepted and placed on file and that license to do cement sidewalk construction be granted to the said parties.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The bond of Quince Hutton, plumbing inspector, was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, the bond was referred to the City Attorney for examination.

The report of the City Weigher for the month of February was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, the report was referred to the Mayor.

In the matter of the sidewalk construction on three sides of Maple Park, the clerk reported having received offers for old sidewalk from all bidders, the offer of Henry Polker of \$70<sup>00</sup>, being the highest.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck that the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be authorized to let the contract for the construction of a cement sidewalk on three sides of Maple Park and the inside coping to the lowest bidder.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the City's witnesses in the Kannah Creek water condemnation suit, viz.: A. B. Hoyt, J. H. Rankin, Robert A. Orr, John Hines, and Verner Lee, be allowed three dollars
