

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 14, 1911

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the Chair.

Roll call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg. Acting City Attorney Duppa was present.

Minutes approved The minutes of the Regular meeting of March 7th were read and approved.

Petition for illuminated sign The petition of S. B. Sturtevant for a permit to erect an illuminated sign at 540 Main street was presented to the Council, and on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the petition was referred to the Mayor and Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.

Report of City Weigher accepted The report of the City Weigher for the month of February, having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the report was, on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, accepted and ordered placed on file.
