

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 7, 1911

Adjourned
Session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall.

The Mayor being absent, the clerk called the meeting to order, and on motion of Commissioner Kolmberg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, Commissioner Vorbeck was elected chairman pro tem.

The following Commissioners, upon call

of roll, responded as present: Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg. Absent: Commissioners Todd and Vedder. Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

A quorum being present, the Council proceeded to business.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Whereas, the notice to owners of real estate in Paving District No. 1, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and to others interested therein, said notice having been published in the Daily News, a daily newspaper published in the City of Grand Junction, for five days each week for two consecutive weeks, beginning same on March 7th, 1911, and ending with March 18th, 1911, provided that all complaints and objections concerning proposed improvements should be made in writing by the owners of any real estate to be assessed, or by any persons interested, on or before 4 o'clock p. m., Friday, the 7th day of April, 1911; and

Whereas, the City Council of said City of Grand Junction, in session at the time designated in said notice, and no complaints or objections concerning proposed improvements having been made in writing, or otherwise, by any owners of real estate to be assessed, or by any persons interested; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the time for receiving complaints or objections to said proposed improvements, has expired, and that the ordering of said improvements shall be continued until Tuesday, the 11th day of April, 1911, or such time thereafter as the matter can be reached.

Mayor Todd now reported present, and took the chair.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

the bill of W. B. Moss for \$110.⁰⁰ be allowed
and warrant ordered drawn on the Police
fund for the amount.

Officer The report of the City Health Officer
for the first quarter of the year 1911,
was presented and read. On motion of
Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by
Commissioner Scovill, the report was
referred to the Commissioner of Health
and Civic Beauty.

The Council now proceeded to receive and
open bids for proposed issue of paving
district bonds.

The following bids were opened and
read:

William E. Sweet & Co., of Denver, Colorado,
offering Five Hundred Dollars for each
\$500.⁰⁰ bond and accrued interest to date
of delivery of bonds, less 2 per cent. com-
mission for handling same.

J. H. Causey & Co., of Denver, Colorado, offering
Nine Hundred Sixty (\$960.⁰⁰) Dollars for
each \$1,000.⁰⁰ bond.

On motion of Commissioner Kolmberg,
seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the
Council adjourned to 7:30 o'clock p. m.

Pursuant to adjournment, the Council

again convened at 7:30 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the Chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

Moved, by Commissioner Scovill and seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the written offer of William E. Sweet & Co. for the \$118,000⁰⁰, six per cent Special Assessment Paving Bonds of Paving District No. 1, of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500⁰⁰) for each Five Hundred Dollar bond and accrued interest to date of delivery of bonds, less a commission of two per cent of the par value for handling same, be accepted, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and instructed to sign the agreement with Wm E. Sweet & Co., accepting said bid, for the City.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.
