

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 11, 1911.

Regular session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Minutes approved The minutes of the regular meeting of April 4<sup>th</sup>, and adjourned sessions of April 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>, were read and approved.

The petition of Mrs. E. K. Sullivan and others, asking the Council to place an arc light at the intersection of Third street and Rood avenue, was presented and read.
