Regular
meeting

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll
Call

Upon call of roll, the following commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Minutes
Approved

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 18th were read and approved.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the report was referred to the auditor.

Communication

The communication of Charles E. Noble, right of way agent of the Grand Junction and Grand River Valley Railway Company, in reference to the matter of the specifications of street paving in District No. 1 as the same apply to the tracks of said company and asking for modifications of said specifications, was read to the council.

Referred

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the communication was referred to the Commissioner of Highways and the Mayor.

Proposed memoranda of agreement between the City of Grand Junction and the Great Western Oil Company, and also the Continental Oil Company, ^{for the purchase of oils.} were presented and read.

Motion

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to buy oils wherever he may obtain the same at the lowest figure.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted

yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scoville that the City does not accept the light standard for the Ensign fountain offered by the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Company, upon the terms offered.

The motion carried unanimously.

On motion of Commissioner Scoville, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned to Monday, May 1st, at 4 o'clock p.m.
