Of the bids submitted, that of the Denver Sewer Pipe and Clay Co. was found to be the lowest.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, that the sewer pipe required by the city be purchased from the Denver Sewer Pipe and Clay Co., and that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to place order for sewer pipe.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Scovill, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Council take up the consideration of bids for furnishing cement. The motion carried.

The prices quoted were the same from all concerns, ^(except the Atlas Company, which was \$2.25 per barrel) or \$2.52 per barrel, net, f.o.b. Grand Junction, sacks 10 cents extra, or 40 cents per barrel, amount of same to be refunded on return of sacks to factory.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to place an order for eleven miles of steel pipe for the Kannah Creek pipe line, and that the order for said pipe be made provisional upon that the engineer's final estimate of the cost of water, ^{including} condemnation proceedings, and construction of pipe line and right of way, does not exceed \$416,000.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolumburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the clerk be authorized and instructed to release the bond given the City by Mr. C. L. Connelly, for \$1,000.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.
