

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 9th, 1911.

Regular Session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll Call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Minutes approved The minutes of the regular meeting of May 2^d and adjourned sessions of May 3^d and May 4th were read and approved.

Communication Recd. A communication from the Rich Hutchinson Realty Co., in reference to the expiration of the insurance on the City Fire Station (old City Hall) was read by the clerk.

Com. of Fin & Supplies Instructed to Remain on Insurance on Fire Station Moved by Commissioner Holmberg and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be instructed to renew the insurance on the City Fire Station (old City Hall) and contents for \$1500⁰⁰ for three years - \$1,000⁰⁰ on the building and \$500⁰⁰ on the contents.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea. All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Report of City Weigher Accepted The report of the City Weigher for the month of April having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the report was, on motion of Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

List of Registered Electors not voting at Special election, April 29. The City Clerk presented to the Council a list of names of all persons whose name appear on the registration lists of the several precincts of the city not shown on the poll lists to have voted at the special municipal election held April 29, 1911, which list was duly certified to as a full, true and correct list of the names of persons not voting at said election.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck and seconded by Commissioner Scovill that the list of names of persons not voting at the special election, held April 29th,^{as} presented by the clerk, be accepted, and that the clerk be instructed to notify all persons whose name appear on said list to appear on one of the following-named days before a committee of the City Council, viz. Friday, May 19, Friday, May 26, or Friday, June 2, 1911, to show satisfactory cause why their names should be retained on the registration lists of the city, according to the provisions of Ordinance No. 188.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

Motion Carried All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Commissioners Vorbeck and Kolmburg appointed Com. to hear Persons from Non-Voting registered Voters The Mayor appointed Commissioners Vorbeck and Kolmburg to serve, with himself, as a committee, to sit on the days named in notice to persons not voting at said special election, and hear reasons why their names should be retained on the registration lists, as provided in section 6 of Ordinance No. 188.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the Council adjourned to Thursday, May 11th, at 4 o'clock p. m.
