Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to employ the George Pierce Testing Laboratories of Portland, Colorado, to test the cement to be used by the City for paving, sewer and water works, at the flat rate of three cents per barrel.
