

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 19th, 1911.

Adjourned session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg, Acting City Attorney Tupper was present.

Communication read

A communication from Barton & Terrill, asking that they be given the city hauling and transfer work for the present year, was read by the Clerk.

Whereas, an examination of the vouchers for warrants drawn against the General Fund since January 1st, 1911, and out of the appropriation for said fund for the present fiscal year, shows that the following amount was drawn on the General Fund which was properly chargeable to the

account of the Kaunah Creek water condemnation suit, and against the water fund, viz., \$3,424.70; and

Whereas, on account of the issuance of warrants in the said amount on said fund, the General Fund has been nearly depleted; and

Whereas, it is estimated that about \$3,000⁰⁰ will be needed for the General Fund for the balance of the present fiscal year; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that there be and hereby is transferred from the Water Fund to the General Fund the sum of \$3,424.70.
