

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 23, 1911.

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session, at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

Minutes approved. Acting City Attorney Tupper was present. The minutes of the regular meeting of May 16<sup>th</sup>, and adjourned sessions of May 17<sup>th</sup>, and 19<sup>th</sup> were read and approved.

Mr. B. W. Robbins, local agent for the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, appeared before the Council and spoke in reference to the shipments of material and supplies for the public improvements, <sup>now being and</sup> about to be made by the City, and asked that his company be given an equal share of the competitive freight business.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder and seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, in the ordering of material and supplies shipped for the City, be instructed to give one-half of the competitive business to the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

A petition for concrete crossings at Main and Eleventh Streets, signed by Howard J. Piatt, D. N. Wheeler and others, was presented and read to the Council.

On motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways.
