A communication from The Home Loan & Investment Co., signed by S. G. McMullin, its president, was read to the Council. The said Company offered to furnish the City with money with which to pay the judgment in condemnation for the Kanabal Creek water rights of approximately \$190,000, on September 1<sup>st</sup>, 1911, and to build complete the extension of the city water works system according to specifications, and take as pay therefor the \$450,000 five per cent. bond issue of the City, at 98½ cents on the dollar.
