Adjourned
Session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 9 o'clock a.m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the Chair.

Roll call

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmberg. City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded

Motion

by Commissioner Scovill, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to deliver to Wm E. Sweet & Co. \$50,000⁰⁰ of the bonds of Paving District No. 1, on or before July 1st, 1911.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea;

Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Motion to purchase car of hay for Highways Dept. Moved by Commissioner Kolmburg and seconded by Commissioner Vedder that the Commissioners of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase one carload of hay for the Highways Department, at \$17⁰⁰ per ton.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Adjournment On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned until 2 o'clock p.m.

Adjourned Session Pursuant to adjournment, the Council again convened at 2 o'clock p.m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The bill of James Woods, for 30 days service as inspector of sewer pipe, \$75⁰⁰, was read by the Clerk.

Bill of James Woods for \$75⁰⁰ The bill having been approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, it was moved by Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the bill be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Sewer No. 3 Fund for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bill allowed.

Motion Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Mayor and Clerk be authorized and instructed

Agreement with R.R. Companies for right-of-way for Sewer No. 3. to sign for the City the agreement with the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company, and the Colorado Midland Railway Company, covering the installation, maintenance and operation of a sewer pipe line ^{for Sewer District No. 3} across right of way and under the tracks of said railroad companies in the City.

Motion Carried The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the Council adjourn.
