Adjourned
Session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call. Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scoville, Holmberg.

Minutes approved. City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes approved. The minutes of the regular meeting of July 25th and adjourned session of July 28th were read and approved.

Report of City Engineer. The report of the City Engineer for the month of July was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scoville, the same was referred to the Mayor.

Report of Com. of Highways. The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was referred to the Auditor.

Messrs. Rankin and Mahony, appeared before the Council and spoke in reference to the completion of the experimental macadam road-making on Seventh street.

Motion made. Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scoville, that the Committee of the Chamber of Commerce be permitted to go ahead and finish the experimental road work on Seventh street, and if any of the \$400 subscribed for this purpose be left after the completion of the work, the same be turned over to the City.
