

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 8, 1911.

Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes approved The minutes of the regular meeting of August 1st and adjourned session of August 3^d were read and approved.

Rept. of City Weigher accepted The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Rept. of Com. of Highways accepted The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways having been examined and approved by the Auditor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Communications. A communication from the Grand Junction Trades and Labor Assembly was read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the communication was received and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Bendie & Bolthoff Mfg & Supply Co., submitting prices on wood-stave pipe, was read, and on motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the communication was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and the City Engineer.

A contract with the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co., for furnishing electric power for the machinery to be used in connection with paving work, was read to the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scoville, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign said contract with the Grand Junction Electric, Gas & Manufacturing Co. for the City.

It was brought to the attention of the Council that J. W. Barnes, employed by the City on paving work, had threatened to strike with a shovel the foreman on said work.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be instructed to discharge J. W. Barnes from the service of the City.

Whereas, the City of Grand Junction is employing American labor, principally residents with families, in paving the streets of the city; and

Whereas, such employes are working for the City at eight hours per day; and
Whereas, the men employed to pave for the street car company are mostly cheap

foreign labor working ten hours per day; and
 Whereas, such foreign labor gives but
 little support to our merchants, restaurants
 and hotels or to the growth and development
 of our city; and

Whereas, such long hours and foreign labor
 is detrimental to the welfare of all classes,
 particularly working men; therefore be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the
 City of Grand Junction that the Grand
 Junction and Grand River Valley Railway
 Company be requested to establish the
 8-hour day and employ American labor
 in all its paving in said city.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg,
 seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that
 the resolution as read be passed and
 adopted.
