The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.

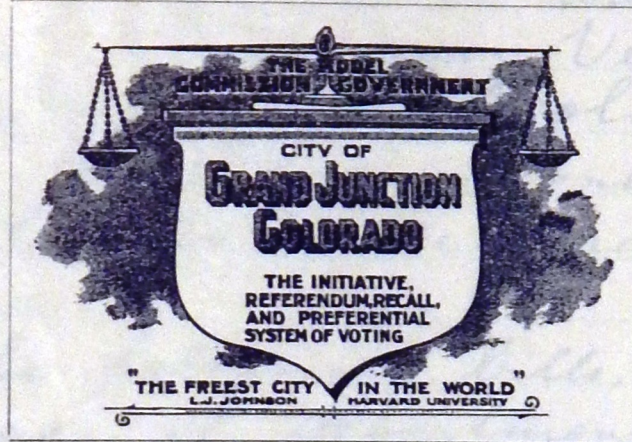

Resolution.

Whereas;

The contract of the City with E.H. Rollins & Sons for the sale of \$450,000. bonds for the construction of the Kannah Creek Pipe Line provided for the first payment of \$210,000. to be made to the City on August 28th. 1911, and,

Whereas;

The City Council authorized the Commissioner of Finance to allow Rollins & Sons 7% discount for such time that this amount was paid over to the City prior to August 28th. owing to the fact that the Judgement against the City required the payment to the Mesa Co. National Bank of interest to the amount of 8% from the date of the award, and,

Whereas;

Through an oversight, no record appears in the book of records of the proceedings of the City Council, authorizing such a discount of 7%: be it therefore

Resolved;

That the City Council of the City of Grand Junction hereby ratifies the action of the Commissioner of Finance in making such discount of 7% made for seven days advance payment for \$210,000. bonds, said amount of said discount being \$237.70. Be it further

Resolved;

That the City Clerk be instructed to paste a copy of these resolutions in the book of minutes of this Council under date of August 15th. 1911 so as to show this authority for making this discount at about the date such authority was so given.
