

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 23, 1911.

Regular adjourned session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session, at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg.

Minutes approved City Attorney Bucklin was present. The minutes of the regular meeting of August 15th were read and approved.

Report of Com. Pub. Affairs accepted The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs, having been examined and found correct, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Report of City Clerk Received The report of the City Clerk, giving number and amount of warrants drawn against the General Fund on account of Sewer District No. 3 and Paving District No. 1, previous to sale of the bonds of said districts, was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the report was received and ordered placed on file.

Report of Engineer Geo. G. Anderson Received The report of Engineer George G. Anderson on the examination of the Kaunah Creek water system was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the report was received and ordered placed on file.

Comm. from County Treas. on re Sewer Districts accts A communication from Benton Canon, County Treasurer, stating that an audit of the books of the Grand Junction Sewer Districts showed that a net amount of \$111.46 of the funds of Sewer District No. 1 had been erroneously credited to Sewer District No. 2, which amount should therefore be transferred from District No. 2 to District No. 1.
