

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 25th, 1911.

Adjourned
session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session, at 3 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmberg.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Whereas, the following numbered warrants of the aggregate amount of \$548.10 were drawn against the General Fund previous to the sale of the bonds of Sewer District No. 3, viz:

Whereas, the claims for which said warrants were issued were properly chargeable to Sewer District No. 3; and

Whereas, the accrued interest on said warrants to date is \$18.38, making a total of \$566.48; be it therefore

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the Mayor and City Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized and instructed to draw a warrant for \$566.48 against Sewer District No. 3 Fund, payable to the City Treasurer; and be it further

Resolved, that the City Treasurer be, and hereby is, instructed to use said amount of \$566.⁴⁸ for the payment and cancellation of outstanding warrants.

Whereas, the accrued interest on said warrants to date is \$22.²⁴, making a total of \$874.⁰⁹; be it therefore

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that the Mayor and City Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized and instructed to draw a warrant for \$874.⁰⁹ against Paving District No. 1 Fund,

payable to the City Treasurer; and be it further

Resolved, that the City Treasurer be, and hereby is, instructed to use said amount of \$874.09 for the payment and cancellation of outstanding warrants.

Whereas, there has been expended out of the regular appropriations for general purposes and for the maintenance of the water system, and warrants have been drawn in the aggregate amounts as follows:

On account of the Kannah Creek water condemnation suit (City of Grand Junction vs. Wm Van Pelt et al) \$8,574.97

On account of drilling two artesian wells 8,526.94

A total of \$17,101.91

and

Whereas, these expenditures are properly chargeable to the fund derived from the sale of the \$450,000 City Water bonds, issued by authority of the qualified electors of the City; therefore be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that the Mayor and City Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized and instructed to draw warrants against the Kannah Creek Water Fund for the total amount of \$17,101.91 in favor the City Treasurer as follows: one warrant

for \$7,101.91, dated August 26, 1911, and one warrant for \$10,000, dated October 1, 1911; and be it further

Resolved, that the City Treasurer be, and hereby is, instructed to use said amount of \$17,101.91 for the payment and cancellation of outstanding warrants.

Whereas, there was expended on account of the special election held April 29th, 1911, and warrants have been issued against the General Fund for the total amount of \$688.69, which amount is properly chargeable proportionally to the Sewer District No. 3, Paving District No. 1, and Kannah Creek Water Funds; therefore be it

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that the Mayor and City Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized and instructed to draw warrants in the amounts and on the funds as follows, viz.:

\$ 40.25 on Sewer District No. 3 Fund;
135.70 " Paving District No. 1 Fund;
517.50 " Kannah Creek Water Fund;

(which total amounts include interest on the outstanding warrants covering said amounts), in favor of the City Treasurer; and be it further

Resolved, that the City Treasurer be, and hereby is, instructed to use the total amount of said warrants (\$693.45)

for the payment and cancellation of outstanding warrants.
