Regular meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call. Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes approved. The minutes of the regular meeting of August 29th, and adjourned sessions of August 30th and September 2^d were read and approved.

arc light. On the petition of E. J. Olson and others for an arc light at the intersection of Colorado avenue and Thirteenth street, the Mayor, to whom the petition had been referred, reported that on account of shortage of funds he recommended deferring action on this light.
