

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 26, 1911.

Regular  
meeting

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Kolmburg. Absent: Commissioner Scovill.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting

of September 19<sup>th</sup> and adjourned sessions of September 22<sup>d</sup> and 23<sup>d</sup> were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Kolmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution

Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction, that upon the payment to the said City the sum of \$619<sup>87</sup> in cash, the City of Grand Junction enter into a contract with School District No. 1, both of the County of Mesa and State of Colorado, for the purpose of authorizing said school district to connect with sewer system from lots 1 to 31 inclusive, in Block 47 of said city, with Sewer District No. 3; and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to sign a written contract to that effect and deliver the same to the said school district upon the payment to the said city of the amount above named; and that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized to place said sum of money to the credit of Sewer District No. 3.

Moved by Commissioner Kolmberg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll,

Resolution adopted the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present, having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers be authorized and instructed to have Boiler No. 2 at the Pumping Station repaired.

Motion Carried The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; <sup>Vorbeck, yea;</sup> Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution Resolved, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that a committee, consisting of the Mayor, the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, and the City Engineer be, and hereby is, appointed to procure rights of way for the Kannah Creek pipe line; and that Henry Tupper be employed as special counsel to assist said committee and to prepare the necessary papers in connection with said rights of way; and that said named special committee be, and hereby is, authorized to make contracts for said rights of way for said city.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

Resolution adopted The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the resolution adopted.
