Adjournd
Session The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m. ^{in the City Hall} with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scoville, Kolmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

referred The petition of Mrs. Alice M. Barnes, and others, asking the Council to order a cement sidewalk to be laid on the north side of Block 137, between Seventh street and lot 11 in the same block was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Kolmberg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Highways.

referred The application of the Royal Cafe for a permit to erect an illuminated sign at 442 Main street was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scoville, the application was referred to the Mayor and Clerk with power to act.

On the petition of S. R. Voile and others for a cement sidewalk to be ordered laid on the north side of Hill avenue, between 5th and 6th streets, the Commissioner of Highways reported favorably and recommended that the sidewalk be ordered laid.
