R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, certain of the officials of the Chamber of Commerce of the City of Grand Junction and numerous citizens of said city have requested that a levy of one mill be made for the year 1911, the money received by the collection thereof to be expended for the purpose of advertising said city, and for fostering and encouraging home industry^{ies}; and

WHEREAS, a tax for such a proposition has heretofore never been levied in the City of Grand Junction; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the City Council the question of the levying of such a tax is one that should be determined by the electors and not by the City Council:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED -

That such a proposition shall be submitted to the vote of the qualified electors of the City of Grand Junction, at the regular elections to be held November 7, 1911, for their adoption or rejection; that the said proposition shall be submitted as follows:

SHALL THE CITY OF GRAND JUNCTION, COLORADO, LEVY IN EACH OF THE YEARS 1911 and 1912, A ONE MILL TAX TO BE USED FOR THE PURPOSE OF ADVERTISING THE CITY AND OF FOSTERING AND ENCOURAGING HOME INDUSTRIES, THE EXPENDITURE OF THE MONEY RAISED THEREBY TO BE UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE CITY COUNCIL?

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.
