Regular meeting

The following resolution was introduced

WHEREAS, there has been expended during the year 1911,
the sum of \$ 606⁷³ on the preliminary expense of
Sewer District Number Three, prior to the receipt of funds from
the sale of the bonds of said district; and

WHEREAS, there has been spent during the year 1911 the
sum of \$ 1,009⁷⁴ on the preliminary expense of Paving
District Number One, prior to the receipt of the funds for the sale
of the bonds of said district; and

WHEREAS, there has been spent during the year 1911 the sum of \$ 5,670¹² on condemnation costs and other preliminary expenses on the Kannah Creek Water system prior to the receipt of funds from the sale of the water bonds; and

WHEREAS, the above mentioned costs and expenses were necessary for the development of said projects; and

WHEREAS, the said sums of money were paid from the General Fund and Water Fund; \$ 5,558⁶⁷ having been paid from the General Fund; and \$ 5,153²² paid and transferred from the Water Fund; and

WHEREAS, the warrants issued on said funds for the said aggregate sums, have been paid and cancelled by money derived from the sale of the bonds; and

WHEREAS, the drawing of said warrants on the General Fund and the Water Fund were made in the nature of an advance for said general improvement purposes, no appropriations having been made therefor;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the said sum of \$ ~~5,670~~ 5,558⁶⁷ be restored to the General Fund and the sum of \$ 5,153²² be restored to the Water Fund, and that the said General Fund and the said Water Fund be restored to the condition that would have existed had the said warrants not been drawn upon them; and

and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk and Treasurer be, and they are, hereby authorized and instructed to make the proper entries on their respective books in accordance with the terms of this resolution.
