

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 27, 1911

Regular adjourned session
The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall.

The Mayor being absent the clerk called the meeting to order, and upon motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, Commissioner Vorbeck was elected chairman pro tem.

Roll Call
Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Vorbeck, Scovill, Kolmburg. Absent: Commissioners Todd and Vedder.

A quorum being present, the Council proceeded to business.

Resolution.

WHEREAS, The Grand Junction and Grand River Valley Railway Company has applied, in writing, to the Commissioners and City Council, of the City of Grand Junction, for a permit for a spur track from the main line of its street railway on Main Street, for

station purposes, in connection with its general offices, at the corner of Main and Third Streets, in said city, accompanying such application with map and plan showing the grades and elevations for said track:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That a permit to lay said Street Railway in accordance with said plan be, and the same is hereby granted in accordance with the provisions of Section 127 of the Charter of said City, which permit is revokable by the City Council at its pleasure at any time.

Moved by Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Holmberg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, the Council adjourned.
