

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 3, 1911.

Adjourned
session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Scovill, Holmburg.

Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution
read

Whereas, the question of dividing Block 84 of this city between the County of Mesa and the City of Grand Junction, so as to give the county the south one-half of said block, which extends $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet north of the north line of the east and west alley, has been submitted, through a petition circulated by certain county officials, to a vote of the people at the coming election; and

Whereas, the title to all of said block and alleys is now vested in said city and the city is the undisputed owner of all of the west one-half of said block 84 facing on Seventh street; and

Whereas, said block is now very valuable and rapidly increasing in value each year, and the west half thereof will be needed for city purposes in the immediate future, and if given to the county will necessitate the purchasing of other grounds by the city for a new city hall and other

purposes, requiring a large increase in the tax rate; and

Whereas, the County of Mesa is amply able to procure its own grounds for any of its needs without any donation from the city; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Grand Junction believes that the people of this city should vote against the proposed division of said block.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion carried, and the resolution was declared adopted.
