Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that R. T. Anderson be allowed one hundred dollars for right-of-way across his land, about one-half mile in length, for the Kaunah Creek pipe line

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the Council adjourned until to-morrow, November 9, at 8:30 o'clock a.m.
