The following resolution was introduced and read:

Resolution.

Whereas, the U.S. Treasury department is now having plans prepared by its supervising architect for a Federal Building to be erected in Grand Junction, Colorado, on a basis of a total cost of \$100,000, the amount appropriated by the Congress of the United States for such building; and

Whereas, it is evident to the citizens of Grand Junction that the sum of \$100,000 will not be sufficient to meet the requirements of a building that will accommodate the several branches of the U.S. government service now located here and such as will probably be added in the near future; and

Whereas, the population of Grand Junction will undoubtedly be doubled within the next ten years, and there will therefore be demand for more branches of the Federal government service than are now located here, and that the postoffice and other branches of the service will grow and expand because of the favorable location and great natural resources of Grand Junction as a great commercial and industrial centre; therefore, be it

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Grand Junction earnestly petition our Honorable U. S. Senator, Simon Guggenheim, and our representatives in Congress, the Honorable Edward T. Taylor and the Honorable John W. Martin, to use their utmost endeavors to secure an additional appropriation of the amount of \$100,000, making a total of \$200,000 for use in the erection of a Federal

Building in Grand Junction that will meet the requirements of the U. S. government service for the present and for future years; and be it further

Resolved, that the City Council of the City of Grand Junction earnestly petition, in view of the pressing needs of the Post-office for larger and more commodious quarters for the constantly growing business, that said appropriation be made available at an early date.

Moved by Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Scovill, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted, and that copies of the same be sent to Senator Guggenheim and Representatives Taylor and Martin.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Scovill, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, the Council adjourned until to-morrow, November 14, at 9:30 o'clock a.m.
