

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 14, 1911.

Regular
Meeting.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the Council Chamber, City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Rankin, Holmberg.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

The following resolution, introduced by Commissioner Vedder, was read by the Clerk:

Resolution.

Whereas, under the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 178, the City Council has created Sanitary Sewer District No. Three, and the said City Council has caused to be published a notice of the completion of said district and apportionment of the cost thereof; and

Whereas, certain objections have been filed with the Clerk with respect to the proposed assessment of cost for said improvements; and

Whereas, a hearing has been regularly and legally had on all of said objections by the City Council;

Therefore, be it Resolved, that the said objections, and each of them be, and the same are, hereby overruled, and the said apportionment is hereby confirmed, all being in pursuance of said ordinance.
