Regular session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session, at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Rankin, Kolmburg.

Minutes approved

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 14<sup>th</sup> and adjourned sessions of November 16<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that P. Chilliis be granted permission to erect an addition to his residence at 125 Road avenue, according to plans submitted.
