

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 28, 1911.

Regular session

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Vorbeck, Rankin, Kolmburg.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes approved

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 21st and adjourned sessions of November 24th and 25th were read and approved.

Adopted and Approved June 11, 1910, and Pursuant to the Resolutions and Proceedings of the City Council Adopted Pursuant to said Ordinance No. 178: Approving the Apportionment of said Cost to each Lot or Tract of Land in said District; Assessing a Share of said Cost Against each Lot or Tract of Land in said District; and Prescribing the Manner for the Collection and Payment of said Assessments," was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the proof of publication as read be accepted and placed on file. The motion carried.

Proposed Ordinance taken up for final passage

On motion of Commissioner Kolmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, the ordinance was then taken up for final passage and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance as read and entitled, "An Ordinance Approving the Whole Cost of ^{the} Improvements Made in an for Sanitary Sewer District No. 3, in the City of Grand Junction, Pursuant to Ordinance No. 178, Adopted and Approved June 11, 1910, and Pursuant to the Resolutions and Proceedings of the City Council adopted Pursuant to said Ordinance No. 178: Approving the Apportionment of said Cost to each Lot or tract of Land in said District; Assessing a Share of said Cost Against each Lot or Tract of Land in said District; and Prescribing the Manner for the Collection and Payment of said Assessments," be passed and adopted.

to carry on the business of plumbing was
read, and on motion of Commissioner
Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Kolmberg,
the petition was referred to the Commissioner
of Water and Sewers.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded
by Commissioner Rankin, that the plat
of the Devereux subdivision of the City
of Grand Junction be accepted, approved
and filed.

The motion being put, each Commissioner,
as his name was called, voted as follows:
Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea;
Rankin, yea; Kolmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted
yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

The official bonds of Geo. L. Crawford,
City Engineer, and Wm. C. Hermann,
Night Marshal, having been examined
and approved by the City Attorney, it
was moved by Commissioner Vedder,
seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that
the bonds be accepted and placed on
file. The motion carried.

Under the order of new business the Council
then proceeded to open and consider bids
for the collection and disposal of garbage
and cleaning of grease traps in the City.
