Read

A proposed ordinance, introduced by Commissioner Vorbeck, and entitled "An Ordinance in Relation to Spiritous, Vinous, Malt, Fermented, Distilled, Alcoholic, or Any Intoxicating Liquor," was read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Chief of Police Hutchinson addressed the Council on the subject of a municipal wood yard for furnishing employment to idle and needy men.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the matter of continuing the municipal wood yard be referred to the old committee thereon, namely, the Mayor and the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty, with power to act.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, the Council adjourned until Saturday, December 16th, at 4 o'clock p.m.
