The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p.m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Commissioner Vedder reported to the Council that on account of unfavorable weather, work on the construction of the Kannah Creek pipe line had been suspended for the winter.

Whereas, there is now being constructed an extension to the present water system of the City of Grand Junction that will provide for the conveying of mountain water from Kannah Creek to the present reservoir of the City of Grand Junction; and

Whereas, the City Council of the said city has caused to be prepared by the City Engineer of said city a map showing the location of the intake on Kannah Creek, the settling basin, and the pipe line conveying the water from said intake and said settling basin to the present city reservoir;

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved, that the City of Grand Junction does hereby accept the map so prepared by the City Engineer, together with the accompanying field notes, and does hereby adopt as the definite location of the said pipe line, the location as indicated on said map, and the City does hereby claim for said city the 300 inches of water conveyed by said pipe line, both for domestic and power purposes.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmberg, yea.
