

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 26, 1911.

Regular Meeting The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Roll call The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Rankin, Kolmberg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

City Attorney Bucklin was present.

Minutes approved The minutes of the regular meeting of December 19th and adjourned session of December 21st were read and approved.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance as read passed and adopted.

 Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the City Clerk be instructed to have the final Rule or Judgment of the District Court, in the case of The City of Grand Junction vs. Wm Van Pelt, et al. recorded in the office of the County Clerk and Recorder.

The motion carried.

Bond of E.O. Stacy accepted
 The bond of E.O. Stacy, as City Scavenger, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the rate for water furnished School District No. 16 be made 20 cents per scholar per year.

Motion fixing water rate for School Dist. no. 16 carried

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Mayor and City Clerk instructed to sign contract for garbage collection

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and instructed to sign for and in behalf of the City the contract with E. O. Stacy for the collection of garbage and cleaning of grease traps.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmberg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Mr. Shaffer, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, N. A. Glasco, ^{O. G. Coen} and Karl A. Bickel appeared before the Council and spoke in reference to the establishment of a municipal publicity bureau, for the purpose of advertising the resources and advantages of Grand Junction.

Matter of Publicity Bureau referred to Mayor and Com. of Highways

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmberg, that the matter of a municipal publicity bureau be referred to the Mayor and Commissioner of Highways with instructions to report to the Council at some future meeting.

The motion carried.

Renewal of Bond of Union T. & B. Co. accepted
