All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, that the bill of John Brainerd for \$299⁸⁰ for merchantin furnished men on Kannah Creek pipe line and deducted from December pay roll, be allowed and a warrant drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Kolmburg, yea. All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report of the committee was accepted, and it was ordered that the clerk be instructed to retain the names of all persons having so requested on the registration lists of the city.

Whereas, it appears from the records of the City Treasurer that there is \$1,114.54 standing to the credit of Sewer District No. 2, after all the bonds that were issued for said district have been taken up and cancelled, and

Whereas, it appears from statements made by clerks in the office of the County Treasurer, that this is undoubtedly caused through erroneous credits, in crediting payments made for Sewer Districts No. 1 to Sewer District No. 2, and

Whereas, there will not be enough funds to the credit of Sewer District No. 1 to take up and pay the last three bonds of \$500.00 each, which become due and payable May 1st next; be it therefore

Resolved, that the City Treasurer be, and he is hereby instructed to transfer the amount now standing to the credit of Sewer District No. 2, and which may hereafter be received from the County Treasurer for said Sewer District No. 2, to the credit of Sewer District No. 1, so that money may be available to take up and cancel

the three remaining bonds of \$500.⁰⁰ each that are still unpaid on said Sewer District No. 1.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

Resolution adopted. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Motion carried. Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Kolmburg, that the Mayor, Commissioner of Highways and the Director of Publicity be instructed to compile the additional matter and complete the form for the publication of 3,000 copies of the city charter. The motion carried.

Motion carried. Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, that the city clerk be instructed to have the annual reports of the Commissioners published and printed in pamphlet form.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Kolmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Adjourned. Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Vorbeck, that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
