Resolution Whereas, the City of Grand Junction has condemned and is now the owner of 300 inches of Kannah Creek water; and

Whereas, said city is now constructing a pipe line to convey said water from the intake on said Kannah Creek to the reservoir now owned and operated by the said city, from which said reservoir the water is conveyed to the said city of Grand Junction, for municipal purposes;

Wherear, the said pipe line as surveyed crosses the west 1/4 of the n.w. 1/4 D. E. 1/4 of Section 26, and n. e. 14 s. w. 14 of Sec. 26, all in Township I south, Range I west, of the Me meridian, owned by b. R. Lough, being on or near the following described strip of land, to-wik:

Eight feet on either side of a line: Beginning at the intersection of the Pipe line as located upon the ground and the east line of the west 1/4 of the n. H. 14 of S. E. 1/4, Section 26, Township I South, Range 1 West, of the Mte meridian, which point is 327 feet each, and 181 feet north of the

s. n. corner of the said n.w. 1/4 of s. 8.1/4, Section 26, thence north 65°, 45' West 181 feet; thence by an 8 degree euror left 530 feet; thence south

710 51' wish 272.4 feet; Thence by a 40 curve right 468.8 feet; thence north 890 44' mest.

248 feet to the west line of the n. E. 1/4 of the s. n. 1/4 of said section 26, as located upon the ground, all being in the Country of Mesa and State of Colorado; and

Whereas, the said line heretofore de scribed is the only practical route for the construction of said pipe line and the conveyance of said water to the said

city reservoir; and

Whereas, upon investigation the city council finds that a fair and reasonable compensation for the value of the said described strip of land to be used for said pipe line across said land of said be. R. Lough, and the injury to the residue of said land owned by the said Lough does not exceed the sum of Fifty dollars, Thereof, be it Resolved:

1. That the bity bouncil does hereby find that it is necessary to use the said strip of land for the purposes hereinbefore described;

2. The Mayor of said city is hereby authorized and instructed to offer said 6. R. Lough the said sum of Fifty Dollars, as full compensation for the said strip of land owned by said Lough;

3. That should said b. R. Longh refuse to accept the said Fifty Dallars as herein provided, and execute the necessary convey ance to the said city that the attorneye for said city are hereby authorized and instructed to bring condemnation proceedings against the said b. T. Longh for the purpose of condemning the said strip of land over and across the said lands of said b. R. Longh.
